Each chapter follows the materiality of the body as it passes through the visual and fictional registers to model itself and be modeled in a process that is always incomplete, unstable, and vulnerable to disruption. This somatic dimension can be portrayed in literature, the visual arts, photography, and especially the gray zones that result from the confusion of these fictions (such as the archive). The book proposes that exhibitionism and visuality are indispensable aspects of any exploration of the *sexing process* of the body.

Every archive is a posthumous device, activated independently from the author's life. To archive is to die a little, even when the archived author still lives. This book, however, investigates a different function of the archive. It argues that writers' and visual artists' archives go beyond the funereal condition, giving rise to somatic permutations that challenge the sharp division between living and dying, between an author's material end and the end of artistic production. I examine a variety of media and artifacts found in the archive--photographs, sketches, personal possessions, and even cadavers--, and I consider how each offers a way of understanding life and the body that challenges the idea of death as the final instance of authorship. My work looks beyond death to examine that which comes to life in the afterlife, developing and surviving independently from the author's living hand. The author returns to write again, paradoxically aided by other hands, prosthetic and loving ones. The critic and/or the loving communities that allow the author to survive therefore play a large part in detaching death from the end of artistic production. As we touch the archive, we awaken the forms suspended in its documentation, documentation that now serves as a preview of their future lives. The archive lies beyond the closed circuit of life, beyond post-mortem inspection; in other words, the archive is simply conceived beyond.

The book explores darkening technologies in contemporary Latin America, with special emphasis on Chile, as the main tools of a new poetic that strongly challenges visuality and vision, and their alleged ability to generate “clear” knowledge. It looks at a variety of artifacts that dispense with the eyes, instead choosing experiences in which blindness, obscured vision, and tactile sensation interrogate the visual imperative. I propose that opacity, darkness, and blindness are poetical mechanisms that can stand up to the authoritarian regime of the vision and question the insidious ways in which light—sometimes understood as an allegory of power and as the original source of the West’s dominant gaze—suffuses peripheral knowledge, politics, and bodies. My book therefore focuses on a new status in which uncertainty—roundly negated by narratives of progress and suppressed by our economy of life—is not only present but can even be pervasive as resistance. Analyzing writers and artists Diamela Eltit, Nona Fernández, Javier Toro Blum, Voluspa Jarpa, Pilar Donoso, Sylvia Molloy, Lina Meruane, Javier Téllez, Paz Errázuriz, and Malú Urriola, this book narrates how they dismiss vision and the reign of the visual, and propose a theory of knowledge in which the eyes, far from vehicles of gaining knowledge, hinder its acquisition.

Synthetic Skin: On Dolls and Miniature Cultures

This book explores the dolls of numerous twentieth-century Latin American artists, writers, and filmmakers, largely from the Southern Cone, and the response of these dolls to their cultural miniaturization. Through readings of some forty artworks, dolls, and texts about dolls, I argue that many Latin American dolls reject the passive role assigned to them and instead work to change hegemonic cultural practices. From the dolls of writer Felisberto Hernández and poet Delmira Agustini, to the films of the internationally acclaimed filmmakers Alejandro Jodorowsky and Lucía Puenzo, to the imbutche-like dolls of José Donoso and Carlos Leppe, and the wax doll of Tomás Eloy Martínez that stands in for the dead body of Eva Perón, the dolls not only repudiate this hierarchy but also propose new ways of thinking about the political-aesthetic order and deessentialize the place conferred on them as synthetic matter. My book organizes the Latin American dolls’ responses under three principal frameworks: first, that of the racialized and gendered Other, or the way that dolls are marked as gendered and disposable bodies, allowing the unimaginable and inconceivable to be repeatedly fantasized through the matter of their bodies; second, that of the body’s continued denaturalization, which includes the concepts of artificial and posthuman lives, along with experimentation with prosthetic anatomies; and third, that of dolls as substitutes, especially what I call the destitution of subjectivity that substitution implies.
